Dear Local Station Board,

It's coming to the end of 2019, the end of a very difficult year for WBAI. I have been asking staff to share with me information on who put in extra hours in helping us get back on the air and recover so we can acknowledge them. I know about some of the staff contributions as well as the hours and hours Arthur Schwartz donated to win the local legal battle.

WBAI is still in ICU and not quite in the recovery room yet. What is keeping us in ICU is the monthly \$25,000 financial gap between income and expenses.

I hope you will join me in reaching out to friends, family, and those you know and asking them to donate or become a WBAI Buddy. All of the producers are being asked to do this and I know they will feel more support if the LSB are also working on asking people to become WBAI buddies.
